Special Interest Groups

Welcome to our special guild events and groups for 2017! Whenever you are reading this, there will be something going on for our members, and I hope that you'll join us! A Special Interest Group can be defined as "a community within a larger organization with a shared interest in advancing a specific area of knowledge..." Please read more and discover the potential of what awaits you!

SIGS are only open to WRSW Guild Members. There is no additional cost.

Felt— The creation of felt can use different techniques – wet felting, needle felting... and it may take on different forms – clothing, accessories, items for the home or as gifts. One thing that ties them all together is a love of fiber, color, and textures that turn simple materials into things of beauty and function. The Focus on Felt SIG explores all of this and more at our monthly meetings.

Rigid Heddle — This is the latest addition to our SIG family. Rigid Heddle weaving is a friendly introduction to weaving. The rigid heddle loom is portable, inexpensive and versatile. This SIG will be members helping members and challenging each other to explore the possibilities of rigid heddle looms.

Weaving—The Weaving SIG is for all skill levels of weavers. This SIG generally meets four times a year to study either weave structures or fiber choices. Members are encouraged to study under different weaving instructors, as the SIG cannot supersede this invaluable learning experience.

Special Interest Groups

Spinning—The Spinning SIG meets four times a year, and it is a wonderful opportunity to meet with like-minded spinners who desire to improve their skills, get answers to vital spinning questions and to get positive feedback on their work. This year we'll be learning about woolen and worsted draws on cotton and wool, fiber prep on combs, and all about alpaca. In each meeting we'll learn a skill, and then practice it and bring samples and discuss them at the following meeting. Please note that this SIG is for spinners who are able to spin stable singles. For those interested in learning how to spin, we can suggest both formal and informal opportunities in the community.

Beginning Tapestry, March 25, 2017

Accomplished tapestry/hand-weaver & guild member, Bobbie Shafer will instruct participants in the basics of tapestry techniques. Learn how to warp a loom, weave a heading, attach a cartoon, slit tapestry, weft interlock, horizontal stripes, diagonal shapes, vertical stripes and hatching. (see our website for more information)
