Dimity: Simple and Fancy Raised Stripes

April 27 & 28, 2019



Dimity is an effect, not a structure and can be achieved in multiple ways. Fabric with this name is interpreted as having raised stripes. More than 60 historic drafts with either Dimity in the name or a raised-stripe fabric have been found.

This is a **round robin workshop**. By the end of the workshop, students will have a generous notebook on this topic, as well as at least 15 sample patterns and drafts of various fabrics with which to continue their own exploration of this exciting fabric.

Weaving drafts will be sent to participants in advance of the workshop, and students will come with their loom warped with the appropriate materials and have the listed weft materials ready to share, as per their assigned draft.



Pat has studied dimity for over 15 years. She is a member of Complex Weaver's Early Weaving Books and Manuscripts study group and enjoys working with historic fabrics and drafts. She has also been an instructor at the John C. Campbell Folk School.
