We will cover techniques that allow you to create the same blends of color from skein to skein. We will practice making singles yarn as well as 2- and 3-ply yarns. We will also cover techniques for making marl yarns (plied yarns with different color singles). Class level: advanced beginning to intermediate spinning

SUNDAY APRIL 27th, 2013 Plying for Texture

In this workshop, we will practice making textured yarns by manipulating the way we ply singles together. We will spin snarl yarns, cabled yarns, two kinds of knot yarns, and two kinds of spiral yarns. These are all yarns that can be created with "ordinary" Z-spun singles. Along the way, we will discuss how to create smooth, balanced two-ply yarn. Class level: intermediate spinning

Participants to bring: spinning wheel in good working order, 2 bobbins partially filled with Z-spun singles (they should be about the same thickness and twist, but different colors) plus 2 empty bobbins, a lazy kate.
